JOINT ANNOUNCEMENT OFTHE JAPANESE AND THE THAI PRIME MINISTERS ONTHE INITIATION OF NEGOTIATIONS FOR ESTABLISHINGTHE JAPAN-THAILAND ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT 11th December 2003 In Tokyo

- 1. The Prime Minister of Japan, His Excellency Mr. Junichiro Koizumi, and the Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Thailand, His ExcellencyDr. Thaksin Shinawatra, held a meeting in Tokyo on 11 December 2003 and discussed the vital importance of establishing a Japan-Thailand Economic Partnership Agreement (JTEPA).
- 2. The two Prime Ministers appreciated the progress hitherto achieved ever since they had reached a decision, at their meeting on 12thApril 2002 on the occasion of the "Boao Forum for Asia", that the two countries should begin consultations for the Japan-ThailandEconomic Partnership in a Working Group (WG) to be set up under the Japan-Thailand Economic Partnership Consultations Meeting.
- 3. When they met again in Tokyo on 6th June 2003, the two Prime Ministers highly valued the achievements made at the WG (held fromSeptember 2002 to May 2003), and decided to mandate the JTEPA Task Force (TF) to carry out the next stage of consultation with theexpanded participation from the private and academic sectors, for the purpose of expediting the process for realising the JTEPA.
- 4. At today's meeting in Tokyo, the Prime Ministers expressed their satisfaction over the works thus far undertaken in the TF (held fromJuly to November 2003) which were well reflected in the submitted report from the TF.
- 5. The two Prime Ministers emphasised the close economic, cultural and strategic ties between the two countries that have been forgedthrough fruitful co-operation over many years, and recognised with great appreciation that such close ties have offered a variety ofmutual economic and strategic benefits and opportunities for the two countries and their peoples. They, therefore, underscored thefeasibility and desirability of further strengthening their economic partnership by creating an enduring framework between the twocountries in a form of the JTEPA.
- 6. The two Prime Ministers realised that (a) trade and investment liberalisation and facilitation and (b) bilateral cooperation in variousareas to facilitate smooth trans-border flow of resources such as goods, services, peoples and capital would help to create a largermarket which would provide greater opportunities and larger economies of scale for Japanese and Thailand businesses. They also recognised that such a partnership would institutionalise regulatory and other policy reforms in both countries, enabling them to stayattractive to foreign direct investment and talent. They expressed their hope that it would have a positive demonstrative impact on other economies, particularly in the East Asia, and that it would develop and enhance the comprehensive economic partnership between Japan and ASEAN.
- 7. In line with these views, the two Prime Ministers hereby decided that the governments of the two countries should enter intonegotiations on the JTEPA and work expeditiously to establish it, based upon the discussions and achievements gained in the processof the WG and the TF. This agreement should encompass the broad-ranging scopes discussed in the TF, while giving due consideration to the need to address the difficulties and sensitivities expressed in its report. They also decided that negotiations should begin in early2004, and be concluded within a reasonable period of time so as not to lose momentum.
